Cook County Department of Public Health Expands H1N1 Vaccination Options.

Four suburban Cook County clinics will offer Saturday vaccination sites starting November 14.

Starting November 14, 2009, four Ambulatory and Community Health Network (ACHN) suburban Cook County sites will open Saturday H1N1 vaccination clinics throughout suburban Cook County. Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) officials are working with ACHN to offer these Saturday vaccination clinics as an expansion of existing efforts underway to distribute vaccine to high risk individuals.

At each location on the dates listed below, starting at 7am, 400 tickets will be handed out on a first come, first served basis. Based on the time listed on their ticket, residents will be asked to return to the clinic to receive a vaccination at a designated time between 8am and 2pm that same day.

Vaccine will be administered to residents of suburban Cook County who fall within the priority groups identified by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) including all pregnant women, caretakers and household contacts of children under 6 months of age, healthcare and emergency medical services employees, individuals 6 months to 24 years of age, and individuals 25 to 64 years of age with underlying medical conditions, such as asthma or diabetes, that put them at high risk for flu-related complications.

CCDPH has provided vaccine to hospitals, specialty providers and continues to provide vaccine in regional appointment clinics and at schools and licensed daycares in suburban Cook County.
