Become a recognized Healthy HotSpot

To be recognized as a smoke-free housing property, the tenant lease must explicitly outline the smoke-free protections available to residents. Submit your request for recognition by completing the form below and sending a copy of the lease or lease addendum for verification. Please email documents to healthyhotspot@cookcountyhhs.org and allow 6-8 weeks for review and processing.

There are three levels of smoke-free housing recognition. CCDPH will review the protections your building provides its residents and confirm the level achieved by your property, based upon the lease/lease addendum submitted. Recognized smoke-free properties, along with property contact information, will be listed on the Healthy HotSpot map and included in the Illinois Smoke-Free Housing Directory.

Recognition Levels:

GOLD:

- 100% of resident lease agreements include smoke-free protections, making all units and common areas smoke-free AND 100% of property grounds are smoke-free.

SILVER:

- 100% of resident lease agreements include smoke-free protections, making all units and common areas smoke-free AND smoking prohibited on property grounds within 15 feet of buildings.
- OR More than 50% of resident lease agreements include smoke-free protections AND 100% of property grounds are smoke-free.

BRONZE:

- More than 50% of resident lease agreements include smoke-free protections AND smoking is prohibited on property grounds within 15 feet of buildings.
- OR Less than 50% of resident lease agreements include smoke-free protections AND 100% of property grounds are smoke-free.
